Late comeback not enough as Spartans fall to St. Francis

With the season winding down, the team traveled to Vermont Academy on Friday evening. The game was animated by Carnival Night and a packed rink, which brought a great atmosphere to the building. We scored first on a goal by Olivier Charette and essentially dominated the entire first period but gave up a bad angle goal to go into the first intermission tied 1-1. Matthew Robertson put us on top again early in the second but we were unable to capitalize on numerous scoring chances and allowed Vermont Academy to tie things up yet again and entered the second intermission even at two. Fortunately, we continued to press and scored the winner on an absolutely brilliant wrist shot from Jean-Francois Lefort to win the game 3-2.

Saturday afternoon we had the good fortune of being able to play a good St. Francis school team at Clarkson University, while also seeing the Golden Knights play Harvard that evening.

For some reason, the team lacked the ability to score this weekend. We just didn't finish the chances that were presented to us. The first period was tight but we managed to tie the game with 46 seconds left in the frame on a goal by Oliver Charette. In the second period we simply just weren't opportunistic, while our opponents were able to take a 3-1 lead off a deflection and shot from the point. The third period provided the best action of the entire weekend, for we scored a power play goal to bring the score to 3-2 but then allowed another goal due to puck watching and poor defensive zone coverage. With the score 4-2 St. Francis and only 7 minutes remaining in the game it appeared that all was over. However, Marc-Olivier Sauriol chased down a loose puck while short-handed and passed it over to Pietro Antonelli trailing the play. Antonelli then snapped a wrist shot that deflected in the top corner and brought the score to 4-3. With momentum and lots of energy the team kept pushing and managed to tie things up 4-4 just 37 seconds later when Marc-Olivier Sauriol lifted the crowd with a rebound goal. Unfortunately, the momentum shift did not last, for we broke down defensively once again with only 3 minutes remaining in the game and allowed St. Francis to take a 5-4 lead. They added a sixth goal on a power play in the final minute.

On a positive note, our comeback showed our willingness to keep working and never quite. However, our poor power-play and complacency in our own end certainly hurt us. Our hats go off to St. Francis's goalie for a strong performance and overall team for a game well played.

The top two teams in each division would play in a cross-over semi-final before the championship match. The boys faced off against good competition in all three games but were unable to earn a ticket to the dance.

In the first game the team met a solid net-minder and needed a long time before solving his secrets. Down 1-0 after the first period the team rallied to bang home three unanswered goals by Pietro Antonelli and Julien Quincou (2). Spartans earn back-to-back wins in Maine

Friday night the team travelled to Hebron Academy to play the Lumberjacks in a much-anticipated match-up. Hebron was sitting in first place in the most recent DII Prep Poll, with impressive wins against DI teams, namely Cushing Academy.

The game was fast, physical and very even in all levels of the ice. In the first period, we got on the board first on a goal by Maxime Ruel in tight with the Hebron net-minder. Hebron tied the game 1-1 on a late power-play when they moved the puck around the zone to find the open man in the high slot.

In the second period, Hebron really took over the game and momentum when they scored their second power-play goal on a rebound attempt. They then benefitted from a four-minute power-play but were unable to capitalize. This was a huge turning point in the period and it allowed us to stay in the game.

The third period was perhaps one of our best played periods in recent memory. We outshot Hebron 11-6 to finally take over the play and essentially competed hard in all areas of the ice. At the halfway point of the period we placed much pressure on the Hebron goalie and managed to tie things up on a rebound goal by pinching defenseman Chad Bombardier. The team was energized and continued battling hard. Moments later, Ryan Bedard lifted the bench with the biggest prep school hit this writer has ever seen. This open ice hit definitely raised team spirits and eventually propelled us to scoring the winner with 1:34 remaining. It was a fitting end to see Ryan Bedard snipe the winner on a power-play opportunity, for he played a solid game from start to finish. Jean-Philippe Daigle added an empty net goal in the final seconds to guarantee the win.

All in all this was an outstanding team effort. We generated scoring from multiple-lines and are starting to play more consistently in our own end. Senior goaltender Logan Vanasse put forth another outstanding performance for the Spartans stopping 28 of 30 shots and was essentially the difference maker in the early stages of the game.

After this hard-fought victory, the boys travelled to nearby Bridgton Academy to finish their road weekend. Playing against Bridgton teams has never been easy, for they are always big physical opponents who finish their checks and compete hard. Saturday's game was no different.

The game began with a lot of energy on both sides and fast-paced play up and down the ice. Although both teams benefitted from early power-play opportunities, neither side capitalized on their chances. However, with two minutes remaining in the final period,

we were finally able to get through Bridgton's net-minder when Thomas Castle finished a nifty passing play from Marc-Olivier Sauriol by going hard to the net off the face-off. Moments later Olivier Charette scored a huge goal before the end of the period by banging home another close-in goal off passes from Juilen Quincou and Chad Bombardier.

Bridgton began the second period strong and scored in the first minute of play off a scramble in the corner and a seemingly innocent play. Stanstead responded quickly on a great snipe by Maxime Ruel. Halfway through the period we really changed the momentum of the game when Olivier Charette scored his second goal on a terrific play and a tremendous shot coming down the left-wing. Bridgton kept coming, though, and managed to bring the score to 4-2 before the end of the second period.

The third frame started with Bridgton on a 5-3 power-play due to some undisciplined play and reactions to a few questionable calls. That being said, our penalty killing was about as textbook as can be and we were able to fight off the Bridgton attack.
